Positive Behaviour Policy

The aim of this policy is to ensure that behaviour is managed in a positive manner in the setting, and that children respect each other, staff and equipment.

Club Rules

Club rules are to be decided as a group and children will create these at the beginning of each year within the setting.

Positive reinforcement

At ClubsComplete, we train our staff to encourage positive behaviour actively in the setting. In doing this, we are naturally preventing poor behaviour. Staff use positive reinforcement in order to encourage positive behaviour, for example: highlighting any children who have behaved particularly well, using the school's rewards system to reward positive behaviour such as house points, giving out Star of the Week certificates to children who have particularly behaved well or achieved well that week.

Red & Amber System

If children break club rules, they will be given a verbal warning first and if they continue to show challenging behaviour then an amber warning will be issued, and parents must be made aware of this. If the behaviour continues a red warning will be issued, it is at this point the child will receive a behaviour slip which will be sent home to parents. All records of amber and red warnings must be written down in the behaviour log.

If a child is issued more than 3 behaviour slips in one term, the child will not be permitted to attend the following term's clubs. This is to ensure all children have the opportunity to enjoy clubs and feel safe and comfortable within the sessions. If poor behaviour continues, ClubsComplete will have a meeting with parents to discuss using provisions going forward.
